

## List of projects that are not eligible for a donation from the Schiphol Fund

The Schiphol Fund wants to help as many people as possible, but we have to make a choice. Your application will not be considered if it is focused on:

- Passive exercise, such as games that only challenge the mind (e.g. bridge, draughts), shuffleboard (*sjoelen*), snooker, gardening, hiking, transporting people, etc.;
- A music festival, musical, making music, festival week, etc. that is not primarily focused on exercise and sport;
- Short-term events such as tournaments, jubilees, training camps or public holidays;
- One-off costs (such as venue and equipment hire) and costs that do not directly facilitate physical exercise (such as first aid costs, prizes, financial compensation, organisation costs, travel and accommodation expenses, advertising, printing, clothing, etc.);
- Equipment that is not really necessary to make the exercise itself possible (scoreboards, ball bin, etc.);
- Other funds.

### Projects with a particular character:

- Culture and well-being;
- Religious;
- Political;
- Supporting individuals.

### Projects that:

- Have already been completed before the date on which the Board assesses the application;
- Raise funds for third parties;
- Take place outside the area of operation;
- Have yet to be fully set up;
- Are not accessible to most people (e.g. a nursery school with a fenced-off playground);
- Will become the property of another organisation.

### Projects related to immovable property and processing land:

- Construction, renovation or design of immovable property, with the exception of sports fields;
- Earthworks (such as pipelines, moving or raising ground, etc.) and associated activities (such as laying roads, terracing, installing a canopy, etc.).

### Projects focused on conservation, operating costs, start-up costs and overhead costs, including:

- Rent, compensation for employees/volunteers;
- Solar panels, heating;
- Union contribution, club membership;
- Clothing, including club clothing;
- Computers and computer software.

### Projects for government, local authorities and public organisations

- Umbrella organisations;
- Home owners' associations;
- Residents' associations and/or communes (due to the particular character of these associations);
- Gardening associations;
- Community centres, with the exception of not-for-profit community centres.
